

Year Two Term 1 Newsletter 2023

Our topic over the next 2 terms will be focusing on

Street Detectives/Towers, Turrets and Tunnels.

Our key question is:

How has Rochester changed over the years?

<u>Maths:</u> Place value (ordering, writing, reading, and using numbers to 100), addition and subtraction, including word problems.

<u>Literacy</u>: Sentence structure – nouns, verbs, full stops, capital letters, question marks and exclamation marks, adjectives, repetitive phrases, sequencing, past and present tense, and noun phrases.

History - Houses through the years.

- To use a source to answer questions about the past on the basis of simple observations.
- To identify differences between ways of life at different times.
- To sequence artefacts (photographs) close together in time.
- To compare photographs from the past and present.

Geography - Map skills and fieldwork observations.

- To understand that maps give different instructions.
- Use ariel photos to label a map of the school grounds.
- Use ariel photos to label a map of the local area looking at human and physical features.
- To identify different house types.
- To use observational skills to study the geography of our local area.

Computing - IT all around us.

- What is IT?

This term we will be learning skills relating to infant agility in indoor PE and Tri-Golf skills for outdoor PE.
