Our topic over the next 2 terms will be focusing on the Tudors.

Our Lead Enquiry question is: 'How did the Tudor period

influence our local area?'

Maths:

Compare and order numbers to 1,000000

Round numbers to 1,000000

Add and subtract whole numbers with more than 4 digits, including using formal written methods

Multiply and divide numbers up to 4 digits by a one- or two-digit number using a formal written method

<u>Literacy:</u> Tudor Tales by Terry Deary

Recognise the features of a diary entry and understand how informal language is used.

To write formal and informal letters using relative pronouns.

Explore the structure of story writing using speech marks.

Use passive voice to create poems.

Create newspaper reports with the element of direct and indirect speech.

History - The Tudors

Remember and sequence key events from the Tudor period (henry VIII).

Identify each of the Tudor Monarchs.

Understand the important aspects of each of their time on the

Understand what peer pressure is and know how to deal with it

Know what 'safe relationships' are

Science: Properties and changes of Materials

Compare and group materials based on their properties

Investigate thermal conductors and insulators

Identify electrical conductors and insulators

Use knowledge of solids, liquids and gases to decide how mixtures might be separated, including through filtering, sieving and evaporating by separating different mixtures.

RE - Sikhism

Compare different ways Sikhs put their religion into practice.

Know what Sikhs believe and how they worship.

Computing -

We will be learning about computer systems (algorithms) and searching the World Wide Web for information. How searches are ranked and influenced.
