

Year 2 Term 2 Newsletter 2023

Our topic over the next 2 terms will be focusing on

Street Detectives/Towers, Turrets and Tunnels.

Our key question is:

How has Rochester changed over the years?

Maths: Time, fraction of a shape, fraction of an amount, money,

<u>Literacy</u>: sentence types, non-chronological reports, descriptive writing, diary entries, verbs and adverbs and using commas in a list.

History - Castles

- To recognise why people did things and what happened as a result
- To recognise why events happened.
- To communicate my knowledge through drama and role play.
- To communicate my knowledge through writing.

DT - design and build a castle (including a working drawbridge).

- To identify simple design criteria for castles
- To make simple drawings and label parts of my design of a castle
- To assemble, join and combine materials in order to make a product
- To evaluate my product as it is developed and make changes.

Computing - Digital photography

- E-Safety
- To recognise what devices can be used to take photographs
- To describe what makes a good photograph
- To decide how photographs can be improved
- To use a digital device to take a photograph.

RE - Christianity (Christmas)

- To think about what we celebrate and how we celebrate.
- To be able to recount the Christmas story.
- To know what Christians, believe about Jesus being God's son
- To explore how Christians celebrate Christmas.
- To investigate how Christmas is celebrated by Christians around the world.
- To recap and summarise what we have learnt about Christmas.

PSHE - Relationships.

- To understand what bullying is.
- To know how someone may feel if they are being bullied.
- To know who to ask for help if I feel unsafe.
- To know about the things, I have in common with my class friends.
- To understand how and why friends have similarities and differences.
- To learn how to share ideas and listen to others.

General Reminders

- Times Tables Rockstars The expectation is that the children complete at least
 10 minutes per day learning their times tables.
- Please remember to read every night with your child and remember to update their reading record book. We aim to read at least 5 times a week.
- Spellings come home on a Friday and will be tested the following Friday.
- Red phonics folders come home on a Monday and include working being learnt that week, along with a mini-book that you can remove fold and read at home.
