Literacy: Running Wild Michael Morpurgo

Plans a clear structure for a narrative, which is evenly paced.

Includes appropriate imaginative detail to engage the reader from the outset.

Balances a range of description, dialogue and action to explain a narrative.

Has a growing understanding of how to use commas to separate clauses in sentences.

Can use an apostrophe for possession and contractions accurately.

<u>PSHE -</u>

to recognise that everyone should be treated equally

why it is important to listen and respond respectfully to a wide range of people, including those whose traditions, beliefs and lifestyle are different to their own

what discrimination means and different types of discrimination e.a. racism. sexism.

<u>Maths:</u>

Multiplication and division- multiplying 2/3/4 digits by 1 and 2 digits and dividing 2/3/4 digits by 1-digit.

Decimals and percentages - rounding, ordering decimals, decimals as percentages, decimals as fractions

Fractions- finding equivalent fractions, converting mixed fractions to improper fractions and vice versa.

Science: Living things and their habitats.

I can describe the differences in the life cycles of a mammal, an amphibian, an insect and a bird.

I can describe the life process of reproduction in some plants and animals.

I can describe the changes as humans develop to old age.

<u>Music</u>

Perform a looped body percussion rhythm; keeping in time with their group.

Use loops to create a whole piece of music, ensuring that the different aspects of music work together.

Geography-

I can use maps, atlases, globes and computer mapping to locate countries and describe features studied.

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RE - Are Sikh Stories important today?

I can explain how some stories can teach people about what is important and how to behave.

I can recognise that stories can be an important way of expressing belief and meaning and can explain the relevance of a Sikh story.

I can explain how some stories can teach Sikhs about what is important in life.

<u>Computing –</u>

Design, write, and debug programs that accomplish specific goals, including controlling or simulating physical systems; solve problems by decomposing them into smaller parts Use sequence, selection, and repetition in programs; work with variables and various forms of input and output
