Maths: Shape and Statistics

To identify and use mathematical language to describe properties of 3D shapes.

To measure angles using a protractor.

To describe mathematical properties of regular and irregular polygons.

To begin to identify 3D shapes, including cubes and cuboids from a 2D representation. To being to choose which graphical representations to sue with a set of continuous and discrete.

Science: Forces

Explain that unsupported objects fall towards the Earth because of the force of gravity acting between the Earth and the falling object

Identify the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction, that act between moving surfaces

Recognise that some mechanisms including levers, pulleys and gears allow a smaller force to have a greater effect

<u>Music</u>

Representing the features of a piece of music using graphic notation, and colours, justifying their choices with reference to musical vocabulary. Comparing, discussing and evaluating music using detailed musical vocabulary. Composing a detailed piece of music from a given stimulus.

Geography-

I can compare a region in UK with a region in N. or S. America with significant differences and similarities. E.g. Link to Fairtrade

I can discuss human geography including trade between UK and Europe and ROW including Fair/unfair distribution of resources.

I can identify the position and significance of latitude/longitude and the Greenwich Meridian

RE - How significant is it for Christians to believe God intended Jesus to die?

I can start to explain the Christian belief that Jesus was the Incarnation of God.

I can start to explain whether God intended Jesus to be crucified or whether Jesus' crucifixion was the consequence of events during Holy Week.

I can describe how different practices enable Christians to show their commitment to God and understand that some of these will be more significant to some Christians than others.
